

Living On Your Hardwood Floor

Remember, DO NOT USE...



Wet mops or excessive water.



Supermarket oil soaps, waxes, or polishers.



Ammonia, alkaline products, or abrasive cleaners.

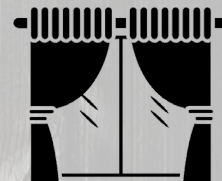
It is not recommended to over apply any cleaner to your floor. Excessive use of cleaners can leave a hazy residue and may eventually break down the finish on your floor leaving it unprotected.



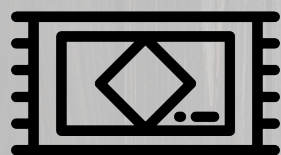
Protect the bottom of furniture with felt padding to prevent scratching. When moving furniture, always remember to pick it up instead of sliding it.



Do not walk on your floor with high heels or cleats, as they may indent the floor.



Use window coverings to block UV rays which can affect the coloring of your floor.



Place area rugs and walk-off mats in high traffic areas and entry points, or where the floor is susceptible to spills.



Maintain humidity levels throughout the year by installing and using humidifiers during dry months, and dehumidifiers in humid months.



Vacuum or dry mop/sweep daily to remove debris that can scratch the finish. Clean up spills immediately with a dry cloth.
